Prater's father and son bears rival the best of Martin Waddell and Barbara Firth. In the first title the young cub climbs over the mountainous shape of his father to get to the other side - and back again. Each spread has a magic all its own, with the bears' laughing eyes prompting the same response from the young reader. The second title has a similarly enchanting spirit to it, with the added fun of a tickly counting game to share. The simplicity of the bold colour drawings and the repeated text are finely judged. Strongly recommended for bedtime reading with any under fives.
